The Equity Committee had a productive year, focusing on bringing our community together to learn, take action, and celebrate diversity. Through our eight core programs, we engaged thousands of students, staff, faculty, and community members in meaningful equity initiatives to help grow and strengthen connections within our community.

We provided opportunities for learning through events and initiatives that explored topics like disability inclusion and Indigenous knowledge. Our outreach campaigns encouraged direct engagement with social justice issues like Water is Life and RAVEN Trust, while sending 15 Amnesty Urgent Action Letters demonstrated our commitment to addressing human rights violations on a global scale.

We also recognized and celebrated leadership and diversity through initiatives such as the Pride Parade and Women of TRU campaign, which highlighted meaningful contributions and emphasized the importance of inclusivity. These events brought people together, reinforcing a shared commitment to equity and inclusion.

The Equity Committee looks forward to building on this year's efforts and continuing to advance this equity work for the next year to come.

COMMUNITY MEALS


This meal program provided students with a communal space to interact over a hot meal every two weeks throughout the entire year in the Students' Union Building.

UNIVERSITY AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

The University Affairs Committee is responsible for the institutional advocacy work of the Union. This includes overseeing the Student Caucus program, participating in consultations, appearances, and submissions through the Student Voices program, and directing university lobbying campaigns.

Over the last year, the University Affairs Committee continued to grow its Student Caucus program and encourage meaningful student participation in decision-making across TRU's governance system. Updates included several new student representative and committee support frameworks, training opportunities, and online resources.

Additionally, the University Affairs Committee organized Student Caucus participation across a variety of Student Voices activities including participating in a campus-wide food service consultation, receiving support for a request for additional campus microwaves, and attending several key university governance activities.
